



Exclusion and Ethics: Anti-Scientology Clauses (FAITH BREAKERS) in German Public Tenders

At least 3095 infringements
(in the last 10 years, and 434 in just 2024 up to 20th August)
of unequal treatment and discrimination through public tenders through the
Scientology Faith-breaker Declarations by German Public Contracts

For at least 10 years, the EU Tenders Transparency Portal, has been publishing tenders from countries, including German authorities, and since May 2nd 2014¹, there are at least, there are at least, 3095 Germany public tenders forcing applicants to sign "faith breakers" documents (generally called 'Scientology-Schutzerklärung' i.e. Scientology Protective Declaration)" distancing themselves from any connection/relation with Scientology, be it by the applicant or by any of their employees. On that day, one of the tenders² was for "31121340 Wind farm, 45251160 Wind-power installation works, 45100000 Site preparation work, 70130000 Letting services of own property".

Ten years later, **May 2nd 2024**, the public tender forbids Scientologists to offer *medical furniture, shelves, tables, cupboards, desks, and bookcases*, to the municipal *München Klinks*³.

In these **10 years**, the EU Tenders portal has published **3095 German public tenders that discriminate Scientologists.** From **January 1**st **2024**, **at lest 434 German discriminatory public tenders**⁴ **have been published on the EU Tenders site, discriminating against Scientologists**, in violation of Directive 2014/24/EU of February 16th 2014⁵. It has to be considered that these numbers are not all, since public authorities are only obliged to publicize these tenders through the EU Tenders portal when the are above 140.000 euros excluding VAT.



The Directive 2014/24/EU⁷ on public contracts:

The above public tender (and many others announced daily at the EU Tenders Transparency Portal) violate at least the following provisions of the EU Directive (more in depth study will be made) and as shown in many court decisions and documentation provided to different bodies of the United Nations⁸, there is not valid reason reason for it, and therefore violating international standard of UDHR, ICCPR, EU Fundamental Rights and others:

It violates:

[Preamble of the directive]

Whereas: (1) The award of public contracts by or on behalf of Member States' authorities has to comply with the principles of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU), and in particular the free movement of goods, freedom of establishment and the freedom to provide services, as well as the principles deriving therefrom, such as equal treatment, non-discrimination, mutual recognition, proportionality and transparency. However, for public contracts above a certain value, provisions should be drawn up coordinating national procurement procedures so as to ensure that those principles are given practical effect and public procurement is opened up to competition.

[...]

(90) Contracts should be awarded on the basis of objective criteria that ensure compliance with the principles of transparency, non-discrimination and equal treatment, with a view to ensuring an objective comparison of the relative value of the tenders in order to determine, in conditions of effective competition, which tender is the most economically advantageous tender.

[...]

CHAPTER II

General rules

Article 18 - Principles of procurement

1. Contracting authorities shall treat economic operators equally and without discrimination and shall act in a transparent and proportionate manner.

The design of the procurement shall not be made with the intention of excluding it from the scope of this Directive or of artificially narrowing competition. Competition shall be considered to be artificially narrowed where the design of the procurement is

made with the intention of unduly favouring or disadvantaging certain economic operators.

2. Member States shall take appropriate measures to ensure that in the performance of public contracts economic operators comply with applicable obligations in the fields of environmental, social and labour law established by Union law, national law, collective agreements or by the international environmental, social and labour law provisions listed in Annex X..

[...]

Article 57 Exclusion grounds - 1. Contracting authorities shall exclude an economic operator from participation in a procurement procedure where they have established, by verifying in accordance with Articles 59, 60 and 61, or are otherwise aware that that economic operator has been the subject of a conviction by final judgment for one of the following reasons: (a) participation in a criminal organisation, as defined in Article 2 of Council Framework Decision 2008/841/JHA (32); (b) corruption, as defined in Article 3 of the Convention on the fight against corruption involving officials of the European Communities or officials of Member States of the European Union (33) and Article 2(1) of Council Framework Decision 2003/568/JHA (34) as well as corruption as defined in the national law of the contracting authority or the economic operator; (c) fraud within the meaning of Article 1 of the Convention on the protection of the European Communities' financial interests (35); (d) terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, as defined in Articles 1 and 3 of Council Framework Decision 2002/475/JHA (36) respectively, or inciting or aiding or abetting or attempting to commit an offence, as referred to in Article 4 of that Framework Decision; (e) money laundering or terrorist financing, as defined in Article 1 of Directive 2005/60/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council (37); (f) child labour and other forms of trafficking in human beings as defined in Article 2 of Directive 2011/36/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council (38).

The obligation to exclude an economic operator shall also apply where the person convicted by final judgment is a member of the administrative, management or supervisory body of that economic operator or has powers of representation, decision or control therein.

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
